Design as a craft **VS** Design as a Discipline

Examples-

Design as Craft	Design a Discipline
Typesetting	Colour Theory
How the design feels to the designer	Science behind design
Practical	Knowledge
Tacit	Explicit

Both are necessary in design practise in order to understand how and what we do. Both can be independent of each other, for instance, the advent of personal computing and self-publishing software ie. MS Word, allows for anyone to create a poster. These persons only have the design craft with no supporting discipline therefore would be extremely unlikely to create a successful poster, which could compete with posters formulated by an individual with both understanding of craft and discipline.
