### Frame of Concept

- Presentation
  - The original context
- Representation
  - An inference of the presentation
- Re-representation
  - An inference of the representation

### Anchorage

Where text and image stand in a complimentary relationship. In some instances, there can be multiple anchorages for the same image with each anchorage separate from the other, this difference can cause a viewer to perceive a different meaning to the image.

### Types of Anchorage

<b>Word Specific</b>	Provides all or most of the context for the image, e.g. the label of a flower in a botanical text book
<b>Image Specific</b>	Where the
<b>Dual Message</b>	When the words and image work in tandem to provide a single intensified meaning
<b>Intersecting</b>	When the messages of the image and the text combine to provide a third message
<b>Parallel/ Diverging</b>	When the text and image are together but work absent of the other

### Denotation

- Primary reading of a sign
  - A literary definition of an image

### Connotation

- Secondary reading of a sign
  - Link to other concepts

### Polysemous

An expansion of the Dyad equation which accounts for connotation  
Signifier + Signified = Sign + Connotation = New Sign
